



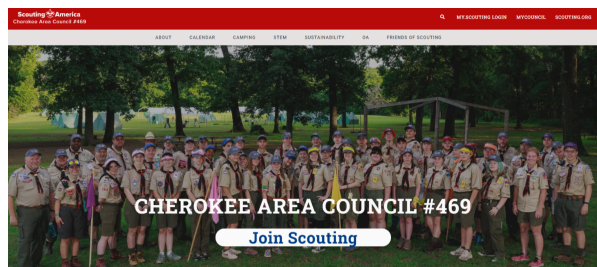

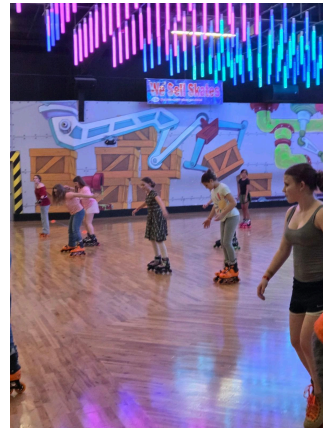
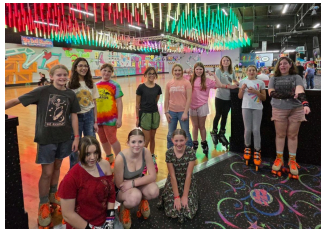


## Troop 33

## **Safeguarding Youth Refresher Training Launches This Week**

The new *Safeguarding Youth Refresher Training* will launch this week to help Scouters renew this annual training required. Anyone who has completed the full *Safeguarding Youth Training* course and it is currently active or has expired within the last 7 days, is eligible to take the refresher training. If the full *Safeguarding Youth Training* has been expired for 7 days or more, you will need to complete the full Safeguarding Youth Course again before receiving credit. Participants taking the refresher training must successfully pass the exam on the first attempt to receive credit for the Y01 training code. *If the exam is not passed, the system will automatically route to the full course to ensure a complete review of the material. Once the refresher exam is failed, the refresher course cannot be relaunched, and the full course must be completed.* The training will be available in English and Spanish in the Volunteer Learn Center on My.Scouting.

## **Launch of the Liberty in Action: 250th Anniversary Challenge**

Scouting America is proud to announce the official launch of the new Liberty in Action: 250th Anniversary Challenge, a special program celebrating the values, service, and civic spirit that define our nation and our Scouts.

Beginning Monday, March 2, Scouts across the country can earn the Liberty in Action 250th Challenge patch by participating in activities that highlight patriotism, community service, responsible citizenship, and an understanding of the principles that shape our democracy. The program empowers Scouts to connect with their communities, learn about the responsibilities of citizenship, and take meaningful action that reflects the ideals of liberty, leadership, and service.

The Liberty in Action 250th Anniversary Challenge gives Scouts a powerful way to deepen their understanding of what it means to contribute to their communities and country. This initiative encourages young people to translate our shared values into actions that make a real difference.

### **About the Liberty in Action Patch**

The Liberty in Action patch can be earned by completing a set of age-appropriate activities such as:

- Participating in a community service project
- Learning about local, state, or national government
- Exploring historical landmarks or events connected to American liberty
- Demonstrating good citizenship within their unit, school, or neighborhood

Councils and units may also organize special events throughout the year to support Scouts pursuing this recognition.

By engaging Scouts in hands-on learning and service, the program helps cultivate the next generation of informed, active citizens.



### **Details for Citizenship in Society Merit Badge Discontinuance**

Citizenship in Society Merit Badge has been discontinued effective February 27, 2026.

Beginning on February 27, 2026, Scouts are no longer able to start requirements on the Citizenship in Society Merit Badge.

Those Scouts who had already started **and completed** any requirements for the merit badge will be allowed the rest of 2026 to complete the full merit badge and still utilize it for attaining the rank of Eagle Scout. This has been standard practice for Eagle requirements and other advancement changes in the past.

Effective February 27, the rank of Eagle Scout will have 13 required merit badges instead of 14. All of the remaining 13 Eagle Required merit badges will still apply, just not Citizenship in Society, but Scouts will have 8 elective merit

badges from which to choose instead of 7, and the total for Eagle Scout will remain at 21 merit badges (13 required + 8 elective = 21 merit badges).

Council & District Advancement Chairs as well as Council Registrars (Eagle Scout app processors) will have the ability to allow the Citizenship in Society Merit Badge to count towards Eagle Scout for those few Life Scouts who started the requirements prior to the discontinuance date, and will complete the merit badge before Dec. 31, 2026.

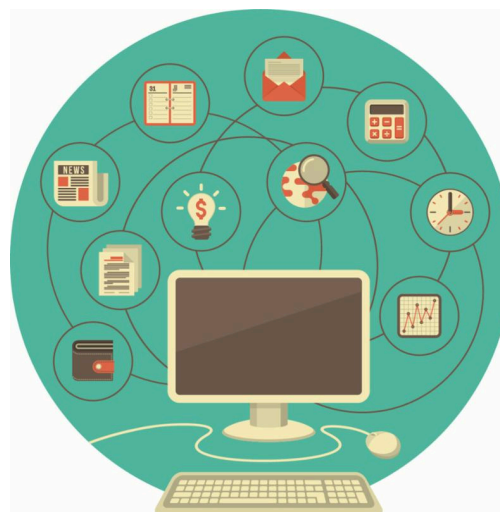
